Through our Empowerment Through Education and Atova Ranger Training Corps programs, we provide lifechanging opportunities to more than 1000 beneficiaries every week, spanning from primary school children to adults.



Expanding Access to Education:

Our programs now serve 10 rural communities across three geographical districts in the Karo Highlands of North Sumatra, bringing learning opportunities to underserved areas.



Training the next generation:

We've established four Ranger Training Units across the Karo Highlands, equipping 153 Junior Rangers for critical operations in the tropical rainforest.

Over 80% of our staff are local Indonesians, empowered as professionals and active global citizens.

Quality Education

ATOVA Is committed to delivering high-quality, accessible education:

- We provide free education to over 1000 students, aged 5 - 18, across 10 rural communities in North Sumatra.
- The Empowerment Through Education (ETE) program focuses on English as a Second Language (ESL), supporting ATOVA's mission to bring humanity together as a global tribe.
- "Before Unity there needs to be understanding", which is why the ETE program prioritizes language as a tool for connection.
- The program has seen remarkable success, with students improving their English proficiency from an average of A1 to B1 on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).







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Good Health & Wellbeing

Atova actively promotes a culture of healthy living and exercise:

- Weekly free exercise classes are provided for all ATOVA Ranger staff to ensure they are physically robust enough to operate as professionals in the tropical rainforest.
- 153 Junior Rangers receive weekly physical training as part of the ATOVA Ranger Training Corps curriculum, building strength, resilience, and discipline.
- ATOVA's conservation programs indirectly improve health and wellbeing by preserving vital ecosystems that contribute to clean air, water, and sustainable livelihoods.



Quality Education

ATOVA Is committed to delivering high-quality, accessible education:

 The ATOVA Ranger Training Corps program delivers a three year comprehensive training curriculum to Junior Rangers based on local jungle ranger experience and international training techniques. This ensures the next generation of Jungle Rangers are up to the challenge of preserving our wild spaces.

Our ATOVA Ranger Training Program works closely with the government rangers, the Taman Nasional Gunung Leuser, to ensure we are able to effectively support the Government Rangers with patrolling and operations.

Life on Land

Through the delivery of ATOVA's Pioneering Ranger Training Corps (ARTC) program, we directly contribute to the protection and preservation of the Leuser Ecosystem - one of the most critically endangered ecosystems on the planet.

- This UNESCO World Heritage Site is the last place on Earth where orangutans, tigers, elephants, leopards, rhinos, and sun bears coexist in the wild, making its preservation crucial for global biodiversity.
- Despite an increase in government ranger numbers from 60 to 90 in the North Sumatra region since ATOVA began program delivery in August 2023, the sheer scale of the ecosystem remains a challenge. Even with all 90 rangers working 24/7, they would each need to patrol 216.67km2 of tropical rainforest each day. An impossible task.
- To address this gap, ATOVA has established four Ranger Training Units (RTUs) over the past 12 months, with a combined cohort of 153 Junior Rangers currently in training.
- These Junior Rangers are nearing the completion of their 1-star curriculum (the first of three year training program).
- Upon graduation, they will play a vital role in supporting environmental conservation, preservation, and wildlife monitoring efforts, complementing the work of government rangers and bolstering the protection of the Leuser Ecosystem.



Decent Work & Economic Growth

ATOVA Is committed to creating quality employment opportunities and fostering professional growth for local communities in Indonesia:

- We proudly adhere to our goal of maintaining at least 80% of ATOVA staff as local hires, providing financial security and sustainable livelihoods. Currently, 83.33% of our team consists of local Indonesian staff.
- In line with our philosophy of the Three Pillars, we offer free further education to all staff, empowering them to expand their professional skillsets and ahieve their potential.
- At the end of the Three year ranger training course (ARTC) the best junior rangers will be offered a chance to train as real rangers joining our partners the Taman Nasional Gunung Leuser rangers on operations in the tropical rainforest.



In just over six months, Siti (Ina) Aminah has become a shining example of the transformative impact of joining the ATOVA Tribe. Ina joined ATOVA International in April 2024 as a fresh graduate with an education degree, Limited teaching experience, and very little English. Today, she co-leads the Empowerment Through Education program alongside her counterpart, Meidi, teaching over 1,000 students weekly, ranging from primary school (SD) to high school (SMA).

Ina has mastered the art of lesson planning and developed into a confident and skilled educator. Through her dedication to 'Mastery of the Mind' training and professional growth, she has completed multiple courses with the Open University, achieving remarkable proficiency in English. She now contributes significantly to team meetings and even teaches in English.

Her incredible growth is a testament to the remarkable positive impact of service with ATOVA International.

Measuring Impact

At ATOVA we set ourselves goals for the first 2 Years of program delivery, take a look at how we're doing!

Establish a Field Base and Local Team: Set up a fully operational field base in North Sumatra within the first six months, and recruit a local team of four program coordinators to lead the Empowerment Through Education (ETE) and ATOVA Ranger Training Corps (ARTC) programs.

Educate over 1,000 beneficiaries: Provide free, high quality education to at least 1,000 students across primary and high school levels within the first 24 months.

With over 1,100 students on our programs we are actually closer to 110%! after less than 12 months!

Expand Program Delivery: Successfully implement ATOVA programs in at least 5 rural communities in the Karo Highlands within the first 24 months.

We are currently delivering free education in 10 rural communities across three different districts, meaning after less than 12 months we are at 200% on this goal!

Measuring Impact



At ATOVA we set ourselves goals for the first 2 Years of program delivery, take a look at how we're doing!

Recruit International Volunteers: Enrol a total of 24 international volunteers in the ATOVA Citizen Service placements within the first 24 months of program delivery.



As we near the 12-month milestone, we have achieved 8.33% of this goal. However, when including the five volunteers currently in the application process who are scheduled to join us in Indonesia soon, our progress increases to approximately 29.17%, demonstrating significant momentum toward achieving this objective.

Forge Educational Partnerships: Establish Partnerships with a minimum of five local schools and educational institutions, including high schools, within 24 months.

Our goal of establishing partnerships with five local educational establishments within the first 24 months has not only been met but significantly exceeded. As we approach the 12-month milestone of program delivery, we have successfully partnered with 10 local schools, including both primary and high schools. Additionally, we have established a partnership with the University of North Sumatra, where we deliver monthly seminars. This achievement places us at over 200% of our original objective, highlighting the program's exceptional progress and impact.

At ATOVA we set ourselves goals for the first 2 Years of program delivery, take a look at how we're doing!

Train 100 Junior Rangers: Enrol and successfully train 100 Junior Rangers through the ATOVA Ranger Training Corps (ARTC) program within the first 24 months.

Having reached a total of 153 Junior Rangers currently in training, we have surpassed our target by over 50%, showcasing the outstanding success and impact of our ranger training initiatives within the first 12 months. And with plans to open new Ranger Training Units in 2025 it is likely we will achieve double our initial target by the end of the first 24 months.

Establish Three Ranger Training Units: Set up and fully operationalise three Ranger Training Units in strategic locations across the Karo Highlands within the first 24 months to support ranger training and conservation efforts.

Having successfully established four Ranger Training Units (RTUs) in the communities of Kuta Buluh (Unit 1), Munte (Unit 2), Tigabinanga (Unit 3) and Simpang Empat (Unit 4) we have surpassed our target of 3 Ranger Training Units placing us at 133% success!

Expand Educational Access to 20 communities

Building on the success of the ETE program, we aim to double our reach, bringing free, high-quality education to 20 rural communities across the Karo Highlands by 2026.



Achieve financial sustainability through volunteer programs

By increasing participation in the ATOVA Citizen Service placements to 24 volunteers annually, we will generate sufficient income to cover all program costs. This financial independance will enable us to focus entirely on creating meaningful, lasting impact.



Develop a scalable and locally led model for expansion

Create a locally led, impactful, and innovative system of service provision that can be replicated in new locations. This approach will allow us to maximise our impact over time, bringing ATOVA's mission to underserved communities around the world.
